

### **ABOUT TODAY'S MUSIC**

Baritone Riley Pembleton is an undergraduate music education student at UMKC's Conservatory of Music. Riley is also currently serving as a choral/vocal intern here at Village. He is performing the third movement from Bach's Mass in G Major titled "Gratias" this morning. He and the Village Chamber Choir performed the entire mass here this past May along with the Kansas City Baroque Consortium. The text to this movement translates to, "We give you thanks for your great glory. Lord God, King of heaven, God the Father Almighty. Lord only-begotten Son, Jesus Christ."

How to help those affected by Texas floods — Heavy rainfall resulted in catastrophic flash flooding in the Hill Country area in central Texas on July 4-5. The sudden floods resulted in more than 90 lives lost; search and rescue efforts are ongoing. Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) is coordinating a response and assessing needs with the Synod of the Sun Presbyterian Disaster Network and Mission Presbytery—including emotional and spiritual care. ## Summer of Sin (June 15-July 27)

The Apostle Paul tells us in his letter to the Romans in chapter 3, verse 23 that "all have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God." It's true. We are all sinners and in need of God's forgiveness and grace. Early Christians began to group sins together and by the 6<sup>th</sup> century, a list of seven sins had emerged. They were called the "seven deadly sins" because they lead to death. Others called them the "cardinal sins" or "capital vices" because they were the worst of the sins.
