





## **CURRENT SERMON SERIES**

Oct. 5-26: Mere Christianity

C.S. Lewis (1898-1963) was a British writer, literary scholar, and theologian. He is best known for writing the *Chronicles of Narnia*. Though baptized as an infant, Lewis became an atheist at 15 years old because he was angry at God, both for not existing and for creating such a terrible world. He became a Christian "kicking, struggling, and resentful" at 33 years old, influenced by friends like J.R.R. Tolkien and various writings. *Mere Christianity* is Lewis' compelling apologetic for Christianity. For Lewis, Christianity is not easy or simple; rather, it is demanding and risky. In this sermon series, Rev. Dr. Rodger Nishioka will explore Lewis' arguments for a Christian faith that is a radical reordering of our lives.
