Forgive us.

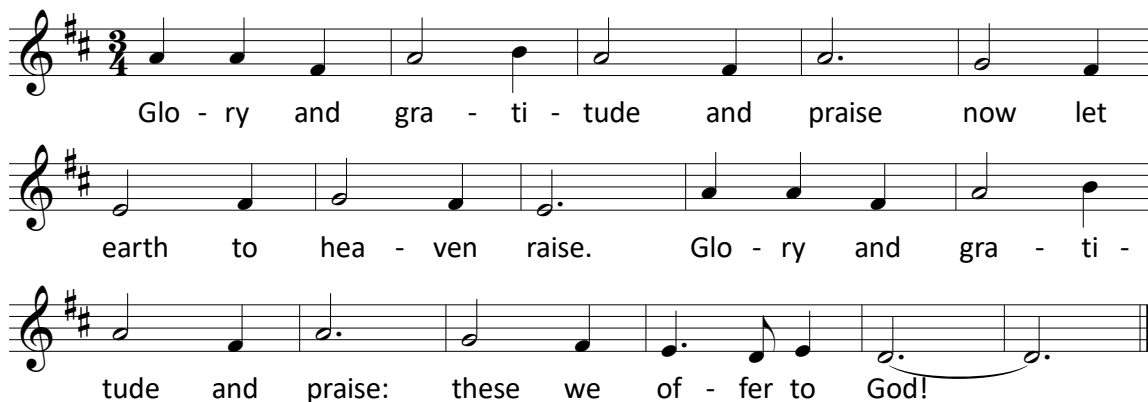
